PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

World's Greatest Shave

Approximately 20 students and staff agreed to have their hair shaved/cut in order to raise money for a great cause. Congratulations to all involved.

James Anderson - Professional Learning

On Thursday 21st April staff participated in professional learning with consultant James Anderson on the focus of growth mindset to further improve their student learning outcomes. James' presentation, whilst thought provoking for our staff, reinforced many of the processes and frameworks that we already have in place in the school to support our students in their learning.

Secondary School Provision

The first Community Reference Group Committee meeting was held at Oberon High School on Thursday 28th April. As you are aware both School Council President Craig Wood-Burgess and I are representing Oberon High. This committee will meet again in approximately one month I will keep the school community informed of any developments.

State Budget

In the recent State Government Budget it was announced that Oberon High School will be receiving \$2.5 million for further maintenance of school facilities. It is pleasing that the state government has recognised that the current facilities at the school are sub-standard and require refurbishments to modernise the learning environment for our students and teachers.

NAPLAN

On Tuesday 10th, Wednesday 11th and Thursday 12th May, students in Year 7 & 9 will undertake the 2016 NAPLAN tests.

NAPLAN assesses skills in literacy and numeracy that are developed over time, through the school curriculum. NAPLAN is not a pass or fail type test, but rather shows how students are progressing in numeracy and literacy skills against national standards for all Australia children.

An individual student NAPLAN report will be issued by the school later this year. Parents can use this information to monitor how their child is progressing and to identify any areas of concern.

Central Australia Camp

Sixty five students and seven staff will be leaving on **Friday 13th May** and returning on **Friday 20th May** as they travel to Central Australia visiting Adelaide, Coober Pedy, Alice Springs, Uluru and Kings Canyon. I wish everyone a wonderful trip and look forward to hearing of your wonderful experiences.

Interschool Athletics

Oberon was represented by more than one hundred students on the day, approximately twenty of whom won events to qualify for the Western Zone Finals later in the year. 

































GREAT VICTORIAN BIKE RIDE




STUDENT DROP OFF ZONE
