PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Debutante Ball

The school Debutante Ball was held on Friday night at Club Italia. There were more than 350 people in attendance and it was a memorable night for all the family and friends that were there. Thank you to Mrs Bronwyn Knight and Mrs Carole Fisher who organised the event and to the staff members and school captains that supported Mrs Knight and Mrs Fisher by attending on the night and undertaking jobs.

Student Attitude to School Data

Each year all students in all State Secondary Schools complete a survey that compares student perceptions of schools across Victoria and then is able to rate schools in a percentile bracket. The survey benchmarks student's perceptions of their school in regards to student wellbeing, teaching and learning in the school and student relationships. The results for the school in 2016 show that from a student perspective we are rated well above state average in the majority of indicators in teaching and learning, with most well into the third quartile of the state. The teaching and learning component of the survey included categories such as learning confidence, student motivation, school connectedness, stimulating learning, teacher empathy and teacher effectiveness has been a particular focus of the school and the teaching staff and it pleasing to see it has been recognised by the students. I have shown the results of this survey to the school council and would be happy to discuss these results with any interested community members.

As is always the case, the school will be organising forums with the various year levels to further discuss the results to identify ways in which we can further meet the needs of our students.

Parent Opinion Survey

Thank you to the parents who received and completed the parent opinion surveys. The surveys will now be sent to Melbourne to be collated prior to results being returned to the school. The parent opinion surveys together with student attitude to school surveys and teacher opinion surveys provide valuable information to the school on our performance and areas of concern in comparison to other schools in the State.

Staff Professional Development Day

On Tuesday $16^{\rm th}$ August all staff members will participate in professional development, this will be a student free day. The focus of the day will be on further developing student assessment tasks to cater for all students no matter what their ability level, to ensure that all students are challenged in their learning and have the opportunity to show sustained improvement. As I have mentioned previously academic improvement rather than academic ability is the key component that should be addressed for all students at Oberon.

Year 11 Downhill Ski Trip

As part of the Year 11 VCE Outdoor Education eighteen students and three staff spent three days participating in downhill skiing and snowboarding at Mt Buller from Monday 1st August to Wednesday 3rd August. After our recent cold weather I am sure that the group experienced wonderful skiing conditions.

Planning for 2017

The school has begun its planning for the 2017 school year. Over the upcoming weeks we will be asking students about their intentions for next year in terms of returning to school. If you are aware that your son/ daughter is not going to be returning to Oberon High in 2017 can you contact the school to let us know.

Subject Information

The Subject Information Evening for students moving from Year 9 into Year 10 and for Year 10 students moving into VCE/VCAL/VET was held on Tuesday 26th July and will then be followed up with the Student/ Parent Subject Selection Conferences for current Year 10s and parents on Thursday 11th August.

These are important dates for both students and parents to be fully informed when making future subject selections. As parents you should be fully informed about the subjects that your child is choosing for the following year and seek clarification from them and from the school as to why this choice has been made and whether it is suitable. Subjects shouldn't be chosen simply because they enjoy it if it is going to limit the student pathways in future years. If you still have concerns or need further clarification contact any of the staff members from the Careers/ Pathways office, these being Mrs Kaye Barry, Mrs Nicola Maher or Mr Wayne Lynch, to discuss these.

School Uniform

It has been a very cold start to the Term but it is important that all students are still attending school in full school uniform. It is great to see so many of the students wearing layers to keep themselves warm and we encourage this. However, students are not to wear hoodies or other jackets over the top of their school uniform. 

Oberon High School welcomed 17 Japanese exchange students from many different schools in Western Japan. This was a great opportunity for Oberon students to make new friends, learn about the Japanese culture and teach the Japanese visitors about Australian way of life and school life here at Oberon High School.

During their 7 day visit, the students participated in a range of activities including: visiting Oberon High school classes, a tour of Eastern beach and the famous Bollards (although it was a little wet so we headed to the new Geelong Library), Narana Creations to experience Aboriginal craft-boomerang painting, boomerang throwing, view the native garden and animals and take a tour of the beautiful art in the Narana Gallary.

Oberon High School classes gave our Japanese visiting students the chance to play Aussie rules football, learn some woodwork skills, create an art piece, discover science, learn Aussie Slang and practise speaking English.

This experience was possible because of the wonderful Host families, students and teachers. Local families gave up their time to show students all that Geelong and the Australian way of life has to offer. Thank you so much to all who made this exchange possible.


