UNIT 1

Topics covered: Ceremonies and Celebrations; Entertainment- Film and Music; Media

Outcomes

On completion of this unit the student should be able to:

- Establish and maintain a spoken or written exchange related to personal areas of experience;
- Listen to, read and obtain information from written and spoken texts;
- Produce a personal response to a text focusing on real or imaginary experience.

Assessment

Assessment tasks for this unit will include:

1. Informal conversation or role-play
2. Listening to spoken texts to obtain information and complete notes.
3. Reading Indonesian texts to rewrite in Indonesian in a different text type
4. Writing an informative article in Indonesian.

UNIT 2

Topics covered: World of Work; History and Famous People

Outcomes

On completion of this unit the student should be able to:

- Participate in a spoken or written exchange related to making arrangements and completing transactions;
- Listen to, read, and extract and use information and ideas from spoken and written texts;
- Give expression to real or imaginary experience in written or spoken form.

Assessment

Assessment tasks for this unit will include:

1. Formal Interview
2. Listening to spoken text and answering in Indonesian.
3. Reading a written text and writing a response in Indonesian.
4. Journal entry, short story or personal account written piece

UNIT 3

Topics covered: Student Exchange; Australia-Indonesian Relations

Outcomes

On completion of this unit the student should be able to:

- Express ideas through the production of original texts;
- Analyse and use information from spoken texts;
- Exchange information, opinions and experiences.

Assessment

Assessment tasks for this unit will include:

1. 3-4 minute role-play focusing on an issue
2. Listening to Indonesian to extract and write a response in Indonesian

3. 250 word personal or imaginative written piece

UNIT 4

Topics covered: Environment; Social Issues.

Outcomes

On completion of this unit students should be able to

- analyse and use information from written texts;
- respond critically to spoken and written texts which reflect aspects of the language and culture of the target language speaking community.

Assessment

1. 250-300 word informative, evaluative or persuasive written response.
2. 3-4 minute interview based on an issue related to texts studied.
3. Reading Indonesian texts to extract information.
