PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

School Pick Up and Drop Offs

Can Parents be mindful of congestion around the school during the morning drop-offs and afternoon pickups. It is important that parents find a place to park which doesn't block traffic flow when picking up their children. We have nine designated school buses that transport students to and from school via the designated bus bay who access the roads around the school. With close to a thousand students leaving the school at the end of the day in various directions it is important that we all play our part to maximise student safety.

The Department of Education have informed me that Mr Josh Baker will be remaining as Acting Principal at Belmont High School for Term 4. Therefore, our current staffing arrangements remain in place with Mrs Priscilla Begg Acting Assistant Principal – Year 7-8 and Ms Tess Ellard Acting Leading Teacher - Year 7-8 Sub-school Manager.

We have already begun to plan for the 2024 school year and given the shortfalls in teachers that currently exist in many parts of the State, as well as our continued student enrolment growth which requires more staff members, we have begun to advertise and appoint for next year.

SCIENCE & ENGINEERING CHALLENGE 2023

Oberon High School once again competed in and won the Science and Engineering Challenge

A team of 32 student volunteers from our Year Nine and Ten cohort competed at the regional event held at Deakin University on Wednesday the 16th of August. Students worked in teams of 3 or 4 on a range of challenges including designing, building, and testing earthquake proof towers, bridge building, code cracking, Mars Rover design, and the construction and flight of balsa wood aircraft. Public and Private schools from across the region were represented with the Oberon team taking out first place by a convincing margin. These 'open ended' challenges require a range of skills including problem solving, teamwork, design and build skills and most importantly a persistent, and positive attitude.

Oberon students have competed at the National event twice in previous years where the level of competition is extremely high and exciting. Students are often inspired to follow these STEM pathways with study and career choices. It was a terrific atmosphere as we headed back to Oberon with the students feeling rightfully proud of their terrific achievement.


It is vitally important for parents to provide up-to-date contact numbers and emergency numbers in case of illness or emergency.


